QUALIFICATIONS

- Minimum of 18 years of age
- US Citizen
- possess a valid drivers license
- have none of the following disqualifications

DISQUALIFICATIONS

- 3 or more traffic violations in the last 18 months
- Any felony conviction
- Any misdemeanor conviction in the last 18 months
- Any family violence offense conviction
- Indictment for any criminal offense
- Currently have a pattern of abusing prescription drugs
- Dishonorbly discharged from the United States Armed Forces
- Physical/mental disability that would substantially impair individual's ability to perform their duties
- Unlawful ssexual conduct prior to and/or during class term
- Inappropriate behavior relating to sexual harrassment or racial slurs
- Committed any act tending to bring reproach or discredit to themselves or the academy
- Used, tried, or sold any dangerous drugs or narcodics including cocaine, crack, heroin, LSD
