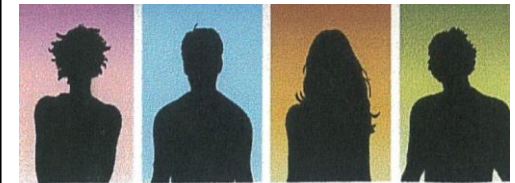

### We will serve youth who are:

- Not attending any school
- Not less than 16 and not more than age 24
- Is in the one or more of the following categories:
  - ✓ A high school dropout
  - ✓ Within compulsory school attendance age, but not attended school for at least the most recent complete school year calendar quarter
  - ✓ Homeless, a runaway, or a foster child or has aged out of the foster care system, or in an out-of-home placement
  - ✓ Pregnant or a parent
  - ✓ Youth with a disability
  - ✓ Have attained a secondary school diploma a high school diploma or its equivalent (HSE), who is:
    - Low income and Basic skills deficient or
    - English language learner or
    - Low-income individual who requires additional assistance to complete an educational program or to secure and hold employment

- ✓ Increase your literacy skills
- ✓ Complete the work ethics training resulting in a certificate to add to your portfolio
