EMS PATHWAY



1 EMR

Emergency Medical Responders (EMRs) provide immediate lifesaving care to patients accessing the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) system. They have the knowledge and skills to perform lifesaving interventions while awaiting additional EMS resources and assist higher-level personnel during emergencies and transport. EMRs are a vital part of the EMS response and, under medical oversight, perform basic interventions with minimal equipment.

2 EMS

Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) provide out-of-hospital emergency care and transportation for critical and emergent patients accessing the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) system. EMTs have the basic knowledge and skills to stabilize and safely transport patients from routine medical transports to life-threatening emergencies. Under medical oversight, EMTs function as part of a comprehensive EMS response system, performing interventions with the basic equipment found on an ambulance and serving as a critical link between the emergency scene and the health care system.

3 PARAMEDIC

Paramedics are allied health professionals who provide advanced emergency medical care to critical and emergent patients accessing the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) system. They possess the complex knowledge and skills needed for patient care and transportation and function as part of a comprehensive EMS response under medical oversight. Using the basic and advanced equipment found on an ambulance, paramedics provide critical interventions and serve as a vital link from the scene to the health care system.
