## PLEASE NOTE:

- **Title Page** From APA Style website (<u>https://apastyle.apa.org/style-grammar-guidelines/paper-format/title-page</u>): "The student title page includes the paper title, author names (the byline), author affiliation, course number and name for which the paper is being submitted, instructor name, assignment due date, and page number..." Northeast Mississippi Community College would be the author affiliation. A running head is no longer required for students.
- If your reference contains three or more authors, only include the last name of the first author in your **in-text citation** followed by et al. (Example: Smith et al., 2019)
- Reference list should be **double-spaced** and entries should be listed alphabetically by author.
- **4 Elements of a Reference**: Author. (Date). Title. *Source*.
- Provide names for up to 20 authors. Use ampersand (&) before last author.
- If no date is provided, type, "(n.d.)."
- Do not include publisher location.
- Place the **DOI** (**Digital Object Identifier**) at the end of the reference entry instead of the URL if a DOI has been provided.
- Format DOI as you would a URL. (Example: <u>https://doi.org/10.1001/jama.2019.17913</u>)
- **Databases** Include DOI if provided. If no DOI is provided, you do not have to include a URL or database information for articles that are widely available unless required by the instructor. Type reference entry the same as the print version. For articles that are not widely available, include the database name in italics and the permalink or URL of the database home page if no DOI is provided.
- Do not include "Retrieved from" before URL unless retrieval date is needed/included.
- Do not include the type of e-book.
